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Stroll & Roll:

Returning families will be familiar with our involvement in the Stroll & Roll program in 2023, with 2024 seeing us receive a 'Silver' level of membership. In short, this program is designed to encourage active transport of children to/from school, with research demonstrating that increased levels of physical activity support stronger levels of student wellbeing. As seen in the map below, 'Park & Walk' zones have been established by Latrobe City to support this initiative, and we encourage families to use these as part of your daily commute.

In 2023, students received individual incentives for using active transport. In 2024, we will instead be collecting this data for each grade, with the grade that records the most uses of active transport each term to receive an additional session of fun outdoor games, led by me! We're looking forward to building on our successes from last year, promoting the benefits of physical activity, and our children establishing lifelong habits of being active.
