PRINCIPAL REPORT...

Student Attendance:

Over the previous 12 months, and in line with a statewide focus, our school has paid a stronger level of attention towards our processes and procedures associated with student attendance. These efforts have included a combination of our back-end data entry practices, working with particular students and families to support higher levels of attendance, and ensuring our processes align with all other government schools within the Inner Gippsland region. 2023 saw an improvement in student attendance rates for our school compared to the year prior, however we do not want to become complacent in our efforts towards promoting the importance of students being at school on a regular basis. Much of the learning undertaken in the classroom is arranged in a sequential nature, and a child experiencing interruptions to this has a significant negative impact on their ability to fully comprehend and apply the learning within.

I encourage all readers to reflect on the number of absences and/or late arrivals your child has recorded already this year and compare these numbers to the table below. Whilst a day here or there might not seem like much, the cumulative effect over the course of the school year can quickly become significant, thus having a detrimental effect on your child's learning.

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
