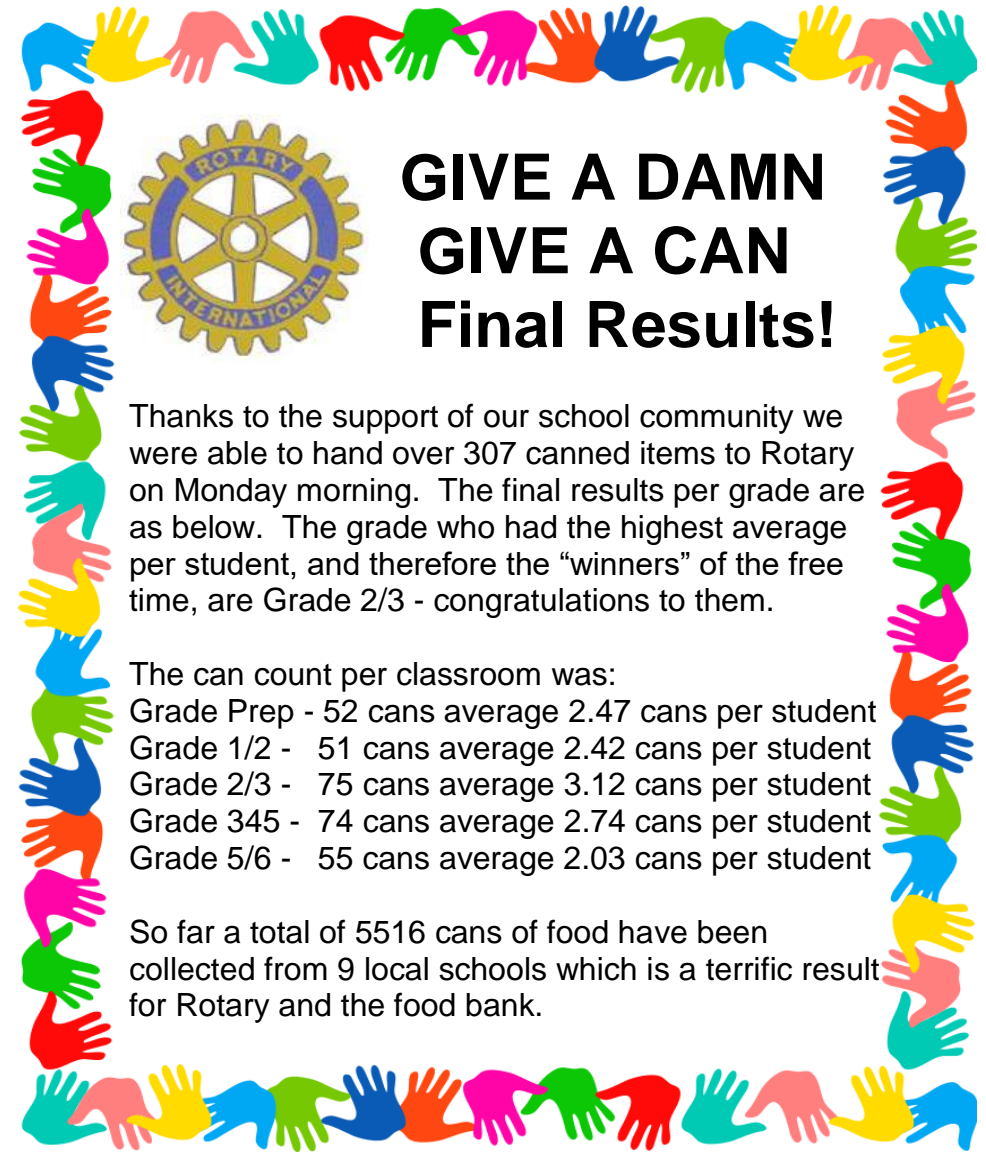

Thanks to the support of our school community we were able to hand over 307 canned items to Rotary on Monday morning. The final results per grade are as below. The grade who had the highest average per student, and therefore the "winners" of the free time, are Grade 2/3 - congratulations to them.

The can count per classroom was:
Grade Prep - 52 cans average 2.47 cans per student
Grade 1/2 - 51 cans average 2.42 cans per student
Grade 2/3 - 75 cans average 3.12 cans per student
Grade 3/4/5 - 74 cans average 2.74 cans per student
Grade 5/6 - 55 cans average 2.03 cans per student

So far a total of 5516 cans of food have been collected from 9 local schools which is a terrific result for Rotary and the food bank.
