How To Be Safe Online by Jackson – Grade 4/5

Recently our kids have been learning about cyber safety, and I want to give you parents some tips on how your kids can be safe online.

Tip one: don't give out personal information or names or school.

Because remember every person online is a stranger and you don't know who they are or where they live.

Tip two: be sure that your child is seeing appropriate things online, most things online are not age appropriate. These things can be: websites, images, videos and sometimes peoples language online that they are using. Make sure your child avoids these things online.

Tip three: check every now and then of what your child is doing online and make sure that your child is seeing stuff he or she should do. I recommend you go on educational websites or a site you can trust.

Tip four: cyberbullies are a common problem on the internet, some people who will steal your information and type mean comments to people or even scam people. Make sure that your child is safe online from all these types of people and report or block the certain mean people.
