PRINCIPAL REPORT...

Welcome To Term 2:

I trust everyone had a great Term 1 school holiday period and were able to enjoy some of the lovely Autumn weather. Term 2 is a slightly shorter term than normal (9 weeks instead of the usual 10), though we have many excursions, camps, sports, and other school experiences scheduled throughout. For those unaware, the calendar on uEducateUs is updated with these events regularly, so in addition to our other forms of communication, this can be a handy reference for upcoming events. I will note though that typically, this calendar is updated primarily for the term ahead rather than for the entire year in advance.

With Monday 24 April scheduled as a School Council approved student free day, our staff come together to continue our learning around a common instructional model. We have spent the previous 8 months competing a large amount of professional learning and research into the Explicit Direct Instruction approach and we are now in the early phases of lesson development and implementation of this into our practice. Stemming from our current Strategic Plan, this important work will provide a common language for our teachers to compare and contrast their instructional practice with one another, whilst also being sure to use a proven approach to instruction that is based on evidence and best practice. This has been exciting and challenging learning and we are looking forward to these next steps.

Anzac Day:

Yesterday, two of our student leaders (Danielle and Grace) represented our school community at the Traralgon Anzac Day ceremony. Together, they laid a wreath on our behalf and joined many others in our community in paying tribute to our fallen soldiers. Given we are now back together, we will also commemorate this day with a short service as a whole school on Wednesday morning.



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Mother's Day Stall:

On Friday 12 May, we will be conducting our Mother's Day Stall fundraiser. More specific details will follow, however should we have any parent volunteers willing to assist with the supervision and running of this event, please let me know as soon as possible.

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Peaceful Kids program in Traralgon in Term 2 for Primary aged students

'Peaceful Kids' is a Mindfulness and Positive Psychology based program to lessen anxiety and stress and increase resilience in children. Other benefits include teaching children to self-calm, empowering children to manage their own anxiety, and supporting children so that they know that they are not alone with suffering from anxiety.

The program in Traralgon will be run by Nicole Leeder, who is a local primary teacher with 12 years' experience in the classroom and a Certified Peaceful Kids Facilitator. The following programs are on offer:

- Intensive 8-week program running on a Tuesday and Wednesday evening after school in hourly classes with small groups of 4-6 students. New groups start each school term
- New school holiday program of 2-hour fun mornings of meditation and mindfulness activities (no experience in meditation or mindfulness necessary).
- Biweekly 'Chill Out' one-hour sessions in Term 2 (no experience in meditation or mindfulness necessary). Flexible booking to attend these sessions when it suits!



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
