The ICAS (International Competitions & Assessments for Schools) competitions have concluded for 2017. It is worth summarising and further acknowledging the outstanding results of some of our students.

Over the 6 competitions for Years 2 to 6 (English, Writing, Spelling, Digital Technologies and Mathematics), Traralgon South students received 5 High Distinctions and 16 distinctions. (the top 1 % and the next 10% of participants). These are outstanding results, especially notable when considering many schools enter only their higher achieving students.
